Oregon Psychoanalytic Institute is pleased to announce upcoming Open Course opportunities -- a chance to participate in a first-year course of the Psychoanalytic Training Program, along with first-year candidates.

Three Open Theory Courses will be offered, one each trimester, during the 2018-19 academic year. You can apply for one or all three at this time. If you're a graduate or student of our Psychotherapy Program, or have taken at least two OPC Continuing Education courses (including Fundamentals), or the equivalent of any of these, you qualify to apply. Courses will meet in a weekly seminar format Fridays, 12:15 to 1:45pm. Take part in a stimulating introduction to psychoanalytic training!

Core Concepts in Psychoanalysis

Psychoanalysis is both a comprehensive theory of mind and a methodology of treatment. This course starts with Freud and traverses the literature, providing a conceptual foundation and working vocabulary as the basis of psychoanalytic training. Participants will come away with a fundamental understanding of basic analytic concepts which they can use to evaluate for themselves the subsequent multiple paths and permutations that psychoanalysis has taken over the last one hundred years. We will utilize clinical material by the instructor and candidates to supplement the readings and provide a platform for discussion.
